
## **A message from the President**

# MF 1155 and 3-point hitch woes...

The Spirit of America MF 1155 and 3-point hitch woes...

Many of you have seen or are aware of the MF 1155 I purchased last year that is painted-up like the "Spirit of America" 1976 model with Stars, Stripes, and red/white/blue colors. But you probably don't know just how that actually came to happen...

As most will recall, the winter of 2013-2014 was particularly brutal for central Indiana, with a lot of snow, a lot of wind blowing that snow around, and very cold, sub-zero temperatures. I live back a  $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile north-south lane, across which snow tends to drift – especially with winds out of the west. And, most of our winds out here are out of the SW or NW... To exacerbate that last year, the field west of the lane had been in soybeans – so there weren't any post-harvest corn stalks to slow down the movement of snow from the field to the lane.

As a result of all that, there were many cold mornings, with wind chills well below 0 degrees, where I had to get out of bed well before breakfast, put on my warmest winter clothes, fire up the loader tractor with grader blade and clear a path down the lane for both Marlene and I to go to work. Not at all pleasant, and very hard on the face and fingers doing all of this without a cab or heat-houser. My dear wife, bless her heart, suggested that I really should have a tractor with a cab for doing that winter snow removal work. Of course, I saw this as a green light, and quickly agreed!

I started watching all the usual websites and paper ads for decent, "suitably sized" tractor with a good cab which could become my snowplow tractor. It was during this search that I spotted the MF 1155. It was located in Minnesota, so I couldn't just run over and take a look at it. It was listed in an on-line estate sale, so I couldn't talk to the owner. I did talk to the neighbor who claimed to be the mechanic, and he assured me everything was in good working order on this tractor. I also saw a short video of the tractor running and in motion. Next thing you know, I had bought it! Now some of you are probably thinking



several things, such as "You needed a 140 hp tractor to move snow?"; or "You expect us to believe you bought that 1155 just to move snow?"... Yeah, well...

Fast forward to this past fall when I first discovered that the 3-point hitch wasn't working. That is a bit of an impediment to using a 3-pt blade for

snow removal... I could force the 3-pt arms down with the loader tractor, and they would raise right back up, but they would not go down on their own. I discussed the issue with one of the mechanics at an MF Dealership, and he suspected the linkages were just rusted and stiff from none use. I did some investigation of the linkages, and became convinced that wasn't the case. I was sure I was looking for some sort of hydraulic issue.




Fig. 35 — Hydraulic Control Quadrant

On the 1155, there is a position selector behind the 3-pt raise/lower control. It has 3 selections: Position Control; Draft Control; and Pressure Control. From in the cab, it ap-

peared this selector lever was in the Position Control location, which is where I wanted it to be. However, upon further review standing behind the tractor – movement of that selector lever in the cab was not resulting in any movement of the linkage below the cab. Hmmmm...

So, out come the wrenches. After removing the side panels from the hydraulic controls console,

I discovered the problem. In what I would consider a very poor design, the support and pivot point for this selector lever is a small “L-shaped bracket” which was spot welded to the side support. Hopefully most of the 1155s Massey built had a better weld job than this one – which had broken off. According to what I could read in the Operators Manual, the printing on the decal next to this selector lever clearly states that the 3-point must be in the fully raised position before changing the selector lever position. Turns out this isn’t just a friendly suggestion. The design of the mechanism is such that it physically can’t change positions unless the 3-pt is raised all the way up. That decal, of course, had been painted over on this tractor. Looks like some person of reasonable strength had probably tried to force the selector when not in raised position, and broke-off the bracket.

My solution to getting the bracket back in place was to drill a couple of holes and mount it using a couple of  $\frac{1}{4}$ ” bolts. I had to remove the seat in order to make room to do this, and still had to get myself in a bit of an awkward position. But I got ‘er done! Having completed this, I determined that the selector was actually in the “Pressure Control” position.

Now I had hopes that by getting it into “Position Control”, perhaps the 3-pt would go up and down as

it should. But, not so fast... With the bracket back in place, and the 3-pt fully raised, I could not move the lever from in the cab. It clearly hadn’t been moved in quite some time, and not since before the paint job. It took a little friendly persuasion from a hammer and brass drift under the cab to move the selector into Position Control.

So, now that it truly is in Position Control, time to test the theory. I fired the old girl up, backed her out of the shop, and pushed the 3-point lever forward. Success! The 3-point arms lowered on command, without any external forces. I attached my old 3-pt grader blade, and everything works as it should. Now she sits in the shop just waiting for that first big snow – which as of the end of January has not happened this winter... That’s okay. They always say the best offense is a good defense. Being well prepared for the cold and snow has so far kept it from happening this winter. If it continues to work that way the rest of the winter, that will be fine by me.

If it does ever snow us in again, and I need to employ the MF 1155 to plow out the lane, as one of my co-workers says: “I’ll have the best looking snow plow tractor in the county.” JB

# Finally!! Some New Toy Tractors!!

Finally a company has created some new 1/16th scale Massey toys!!! These have been a long time coming but they have finally realized there are more than just John Deere and IH collectors out here!!

Now for the new line of tractors from **Spec-Cast!!!**

The first tractor out is the Massey Ferguson 1150. This tractor was produced for the **Toy Tractor Times** magazine. **TTT** has a tractor each year but it has been many years since it was a Massey. I think the last one was a crude little Pony.



The 1150 is definitely not crude!! It is highly detailed with dual wheels and ROPS. You can almost hear the big V-8 sitting there purring along. This is an exceptional toy for any one's collection. They are hard to find but they are out there!!

This tractor will cost you from \$70.00 to about \$90.00 plus shipping. Model Number SCT 491.

The second release is the same Massey Ferguson 1150 tractor w/duals for the **Toy Tractor Times**. This is very special because they only made a handful of these tractors. They have become known as "Chase" tractors. They are randomly put into shipping boxes with the regular **TTT** tractors, so it is somewhat luck (and knowing dealers) to be able to get one.

The only real difference between the two tractors is the ROPS. The Chase tractor has a shade cover on the top. Unfortunately it is eerily painted with, what looks to be, IH cream!!





The "Chase" tractor will cost somewhere over \$100.00 plus shipping. It is nice!! Model Number SCT 492.

The third tractor is again made by Spec Cast and is the 2015 Summer Farm Toy Show model. It is a Massey Ferguson 1130. It has single rear wheels and rear weights. Again this will be a very nice collectible for someone's shelf.. It will be available after the Summer Farm Toy Show in June. Model Number SCT 509.



The fourth tractor will be a shelf model of the Massey Ferguson 1100 tractor. It should be the least expensive but it will still be in the \$65 - \$75 range. It might already be available? I just have not looked for it yet. Model Number SCT 497.

## Coming Soon!!

Something you might also be watching for in the toy tractor line will be various versions of the Massey Harris 44 that will be released by Universal Hobbies. They have become a major toy maker with quality detailed models. These tractors will hold some significant "value" because the models used by Universal Hobbies were from our very own John Bush and his large collection of 44 variations. I have not heard what variations they will be making, but you can be assured one of them will be the 44 Standard.
