Charles F. Shields, 72, of Greensburg passed away Friday, February 7, 2014 at 11:42 a.m. at his residence. He was born June 4, 1941 in Connersville, the son of Willard C. and Ethelada (Gray) Shields.

Charles was raised in Rush County in the Mauzy area and was a Decatur County resident since 1965. He graduated from New Salem

High School in 1959 and Purdue University in 1964 with a degree in Animal Science and Agronomy.

Charles had been employed by Funks G. Hybrids, McCurdy Seeds and Golden Harvest Seeds.

He was a very active member of the Indiana Massey Collectors Association. He served on the Board of Directors, helped guide various events and activities and most recently volunteered to serve on the Massey Exposition of North America Steering Committee.
