Both a General Membership meeting and Board of Directors meeting were held.

Additional information was shared with the group on the good feedback we continue to receive for the 2014 MENA. If you are

interested in serving as an officer, we would also like to hear from you.

Speaking of the IMCA 2015 Spring Meeting... We need to establish both a date, and a host. The two current best options on dates, in order to avoid conflict with the MCA and other Chapter spring meetings, and Easter, are March 21st and April 11th. My first preference would be the March 21st date so that we don't get on top of planting season.

If you are interested in hosting the IMCA 2015 Spring Meeting, please let me know as soon as possible so that we can start planning. The IMCA will reimburse for the meat, drinks, and table service. President John Bush called the meeting to order at 1:03 pm according to Central Indiana clocks.

President Bush handed out the list of current IMCA Board of Directors and Officers and asked for any corrections or changes to the information included.

Secretary Paul Wilkinson presented the minutes of the April 12, 2014 Meeting. The minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer Gary Emsweller presented the IMCA treasurer's report. The report was approved as presented.

Mike Jones reported that we received fantastic feedback from the National Association. It was also reported MCA Plow Day was a success. Members participated with 25 tractors and 30 plows. All attendees had an enjoyable time. The Sager and Armstrong families cohosted the day. Plans are being made for another plow day in 2015.

The nominating committee reported that 2 Board Members, Tom Tague and Randy Schaefer, have board terms expiring this year. Please get nominations in soon. Nominations should be sent to Garry Ryan. Board Member and officer term assignments are staggered so there are different terms that expire every year.

Old Business

President Bush shared that MENA was a great success. Mike and Dawn Dieckmann of the Pioneer Club worked well with IMCA. The Pioneer Club's gate receipts were high enough that IMCA did not have to share in the cost of the tent. The Pioneers Club picked up the entire cost.

Many visitors commented that they felt very welcome and enjoyed the fellowship, conversation, displays, refreshments and vendors while visiting the tent.

Treasurer Emsweller shared the MENA financial report. The auction made \$8,070. Since all the items were donated, there were no expenses. We did show a small loss on the banquet. Gary also shared the profit

statement by activity.

Treasurer Emsweller also shared the inventory of equipment for the 2014 MENA show at Rushville. The grand total of all Massey family items was 291.

Gary thanked everyone for helping to make the 2014 MENA show a great success.

Tom Tague reported that we were the only club that used our tent for hospitality and others will likely follow our lead. Mr. Fraley, of Fraley Sales and Service, and one of our meal sponsors, enjoyed the activities so much that he is likely to help sponsor Massey activities in the future.

New Business

The White River Valley Antique Show will serve as our host for the Indiana Massey Collectors Show in 2015. The show takes place from September 10th through September 12th. Mike Jones and Gary Emsweller went to Elnora on Friday of their show to check things out and to make some contacts. The annual attendance of the show is about 20,000.

They brought back lots of excellent information about the show and what we as the IMCA Chapter will need to accomplish before the show begins. It should be another great time for everyone to attend and enjoy the fall weekend in Southern Indiana.

President Bush reported that the show committee contacts are Gary Emsweller, Tom Tague, Randy Schaefer, Glynn Graham and John Bush.

President Bush also expressed the need to establish a state IMCA site selection committee. Mike Jones moved to make the IMCA board members the state show site selection committee. Bob Rentchler seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The MCA Spring Meeting will be March 14th with a possible date for the IMCA meeting being March 21st.

Being no further business, President Bush declared the meeting closed.

IMCA State Show - Elnora, IN September 10-13

Everyone seems to still be talking about the great Massey Exposition of North America the Indiana Chapter planned and hosted this past summer. However, it is time to move forward and begin planning the 2015 IMCA State Show!

The 2015 edition of the IMCA State Show will be held in conjunction with the 31st Annual White River Valley Antique Show in Elnora, Indiana, September 10-13, 2015. (The weekend after Labor Day) The Elnora show is one of the larger shows held each year in the State of Indiana. The show features a steam show, many active demonstrations and a huge flea market.

A special area has be designated for the large family of Masseys. An opened sided 60' x 75' building will also be available for memorabilia, display tables and visiting. If you plan to display items or memorabilia be reminded to bring your own tables. No tables will be provided by the show grounds.

Fees:

Everyone pays to play - Similar to Rushville!! \$10.00 per person for the weekend. This allows individuals to come and go as they wish. Children 12 and under are free.

UTVs and golf carts are allowed but must be registered at \$10.00 per unit and everyone MUST SHOW Certificate of Insurance with \$500,000 coverage for their unit. No UTVs or carts allowed in flea market area.

Camping & Hotels:

Camping is extremely tight, but they have reserved 10-12 spots for individuals wanting to camp. Sites have 30 amp service

and water. No promise that they will be together. Cost is \$15.00 per night. A few 50 amp locations could be available at \$30 per night. We need to get these committed very soon if we want to keep them. If you plan to camp at Elnora please let Gary Emsweller (317 -745-7949 or MasseyH@aol.com) know as soon as possible.

Baymont, Holiday Inn Express, Budget Hotels, and Theroff Motel are located in Washington, Indiana. No arrangements have been made as of this printing. They are approximately 17 miles from the grounds.

Tractor Drive:

Although WRVAA does not sponsor a tractor drive, they will not prohibit IMCA planning a tractor drive on Thursday morning. John Dunning of Spencer and a member of the Board of Directors of WRVAA has volunteered to develop and plan a route for a drive, if we so choose. It would start and end at the show grounds and would include a breakfast or lunch depending on the start and length. This is still tentative but we hope to make it available to you and your family. More details will follow.

We also will be planning a banquet and auction on Saturday evening so be thinking about a special Massey related item you might want to donate for that fun event!

Your State Show Committee will be working throughout the winter putting together details to make this show nearly as exciting as the 2014 show. Look at future IMCA Newsletters for more details. Mark your calendar for another great IMCA Show!!
